The activities are set every Tuesday and will be open and accessible for two weeks.

Tuesday 9th April	<u>Purple Mash</u> Can you design your own superhero cape?

Tuesday 14th May	<u>Purple Mash</u> When I grow up. Create a picture with a sentence or two, to show what you would like to be when you grow up.

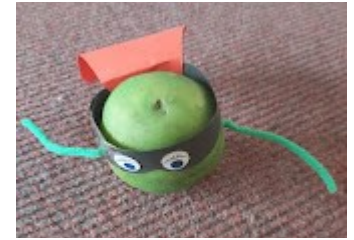

Supertato superhero – 9th April

Can you create a superhero using a potato? You could create your potato in the style of a traditional superhero or think about real-life superheroes and make a potato based on one of these roles. Here is my potato in the style of the Evil Pea



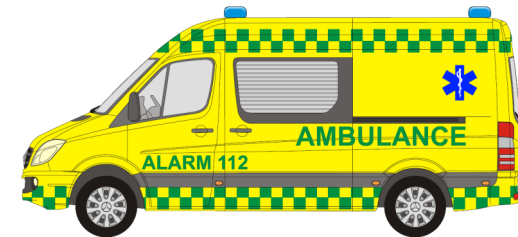
Uniform – 16th April

Can you design a hat or some headwear for a real life superhero? For example a fire officer or lollipop ladies hat? If your superhero doesn't wear a hat think about whether they might have some other accessories you could draw or create, like a police officer's badge.



Emergency! - 23rd April

Can you create a model ambulance? You might like to use construction blocks you have at home, or get even more creative by using boxes, tubes, craft resources you have at home.



Fire, fire! – 30th April



Explore how loud different sounds you can hear at home are, such as the trees outside, a car engine or a car horn, the television, a pet barking or meowing, and a smoke alarm. Do you ever hear your smoke alarm? What does it do?

Why is it so loud? How many smoke alarms do you have in your house? Why are they in those spots?

Who helps me? - 7th May

Make a poster showing all the people you can think of (in jobs or otherwise) who help you.

Have a look at the song on the next page. See if you can learn and sing one of its verses. Could you add some body percussion and instrumental accompaniment?

(Sing to the tune of 'Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star'.)

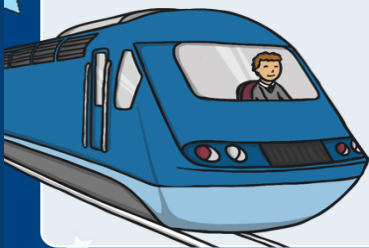
When I grow up, I could be,

Big Cat Phonics reading books

Our home reading books link closely to the Little Wandle Phonics scheme we follow in school. Each child will read a shared book 3 times in school, with sessions focussed on word reading, prosody and comprehension. Their weekly book will then be shared with you at home. Some children will also have an additional home reading 'school book'. Please read this *at least* 3 times.



All books should be read regularly at home so children build up fluency, and understanding of the text. Children should be able to sight read at least 80% of the book before they move onto the next which means practice makes perfect! When doing any reading at home, please date, sign or initial every time they have read at home.

Maths

Mathletics is available to complete activities and gain certificates in celebration Assembly.

Look for your log-in at the back of your reading diary.

Please also take a look at the new FREE app from White Rose Maths called 1-Minute Maths. You can download the app on iPad, Android and Kindle. There is also a downloadable chart for parents to track which activities children do and when.

It has lots of fun activities great for children in Early Years and uses lots of the resources and vocabulary our children will be familiar with. It would be great to dip in and out of to consolidate knowledge and understanding of various number concepts.
